Spotlight Story: Delta Eta Pi

The National Dance Society has created a national dance honor society to recognize students and their advisors for outstanding achievement in dance, including performance, choreography, scholarship, technology, and community service. Chapters can be established in middle and high schools, colleges/ universities, and private studios to recognize artistic and academic achievement and promote dance education within the



Members receive the $\Delta H\Pi$ pin and membership certificate and may be eligible for special certificates or other awards for achievement in choreography, performance,

institution and its local community.

Just as many institutions have
honor societies for chemistry, math,
or English, dance programs can
take their place among those other
academic societies. Students have
an opportunity to expand their
vision to encompass a greater
range of activities and service
through dance and the arts.

Criteria for membership selection requires that students have and maintain a B (3.2) average, participate in community service each year, and be actively involved in dance classes and as performers, choreographers, scholars, and/or technical crew.

The goals of Delta Eta Pi include:

- Providing student dancers
 with an honor society
 specifically focused on dance
- Recognizing scholarly achievements and academic excellence
- Providing opportunities to be published in NDS &/or ΔΗΠ publications
- Encouraging choreographic endeavors
- Providing networking opportunities with other ΔΗΠ members
- Providing contacts with dance professionals
- Providing credentials that may assist with future employment
- Fostering leadership skills
- Increasing venues for performances or

community service, special projects, and/or scholarly works; may be honored in their senior year for service activities, scholarship, and artistry; and may wear honor cords and/or stoles at their commencement ceremony. They also have opportunities to attend dance-related events and network with other students and $\Delta H\Pi$ members; get leadership experience and training as an officer of a chapter; and share their scholarship through expository writing, poetry, or photography in the *Delta Eta Pi Journal* designed specifically for chapter members.

The $\Delta H\Pi$ dance honor society can be a tool to recognize students' successes and empower them to achieve. Earning an honor society pin demonstrates that students have accomplished something that makes them special and puts them at the top of their chosen field. Having an honor society listed on their resumé provides a tangible sign of their academic success. A chapter of the NDS dance honor society magnifies the innovation, skills, and scholarship that your dance program brings to your school and community, raises the profile and stature of your dance program, and increases the visibility of dance as a creative, academic subject.

Your school or studio can form a chapter to be part of this popular addition to services offered by the National Dance Society.

- Allowing college students to mentor secondary students and hone teaching skills – experience that can be listed as community service or leadership experience on a resume that will strengthen their marketability upon graduation.


